Have a wonderful weekend and enjoy the last few days of September!

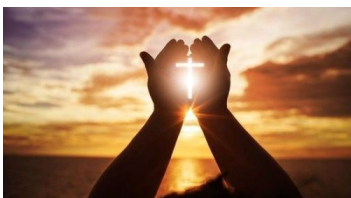
Prayer at Home

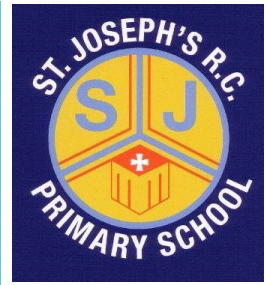

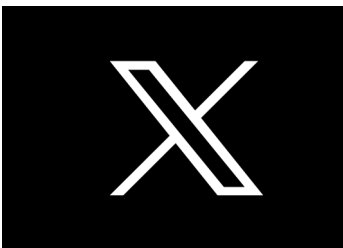
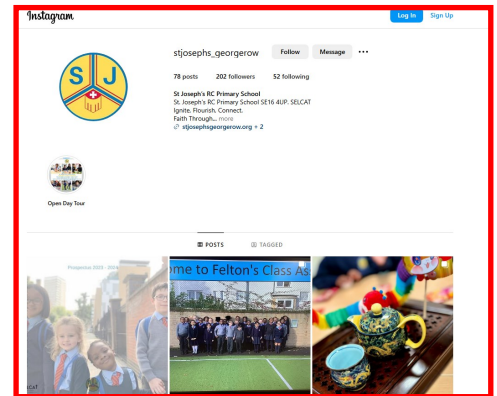
